FIELD HOCKEY CANADA THE CANADIAN POLICY ON AGAINST DOPING IN SPORT

Update October 2017

The Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) is Canada's national anti-doping organization. The CCES implements the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) on behalf of the Canadian sport community.

By adopting and implementing the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP), Field Hockey Canada demonstrates commitment to clean sport by agreeing to be bound by the CADP's core principles and fulfilling their defined roles and responsibilities. Furthermore, they reflect the Canadian sport system's support of international efforts to prevent doping made by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), the International Olympic Committee (IOC), the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) and International Federations.

The CADP is a set of rules with respect to the use of prohibited substances and methods in sport adopted by national sport organizations (NSO) and multi-sport organizations (MSO) that serves to protect the integrity of sport and the rights of clean athletes.

The CADP is compliant with the [World Anti-Doping Code](#) (Code) and its five [International Standards](#) dealing with various technical areas along with their associated Technical Documents. Field Hockey Canada including athletes, coaches, staff and support personal accept these rules as a condition of participation in sport and agree to be bound by these rules.
