Q2: D) Any time except during the award of a penalty corner

Q3: FALSE – Time is not stopped for substitutions. This includes not stopping the time for a goalkeeper substitution, including following a goalkeeper injury or suspension.

Q4: B) four 15-minute quarters; half time of 5 minutes

Q5: FALSE- The match begins with a coin toss, with the winner to determine if they want to start with a centre pass or choose which goal to attack in the first two quarters.

Q6: C) 15 metres of the back- line or within 5 metres of the circle

Q7: B) 3m – In indoor Hockey, opponents must be at least 3 metres from the ball, whereas in outdoor Hockey they must be 5m away from a free hit.

Q8: TRUE

Q9: TRUE – Also, if the ball is in the air as a result of a legitimate shot at goal which has rebounded from the goalkeeper, defender or from the goal-post or cross-bar, the ball may be stopped by a player of either team.

Q10: A) Stick - They can use their stick inside the 23m circle they are defending, and it is the only item permitted to play the ball outside said circle.

Q11: D) All of the above - For the duration of each temporary green and yellow card suspension of a player on or off the field, the offending team plays with one fewer player. For each permanent suspension, the offending team plays for the remainder of the match with one fewer player.

Q12: FALSE - The player only commits an offence if they gain an advantage or if they position themselves with the intention of stopping the ball in this way. It is also not an offence if the ball hits the hand holding the stick but would otherwise have hit the stick.

Q14: B) Raising one arm straight up in the air

Q15: FALSE – Not only do umpires ensure players observe the rules, but they also ensure that every game is played in the right spirit helping to increase the enjoyment of the game for players, spectators, and others.
